

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Inspired by a talk at the Priest Conference in California earlier this month, I've been dedicating some leisure hours this past week to penning a little booklet about our patron, Saint Mark. In honor of the World Day of Consecrated Life this Friday, here is a teaser drawn from my "investigations."

What do we know about the *vocation* of St. Mark? Well, we know that it was brought about by St. Barnabas. Barnabas was the older cousin of Mark (Col 4:10). He was also something of an eye for talent: when Saul was "exiled" to Tarsus after his conversion on account of the attempts against his life (Acts 9:30) and likely still distrusted by many disciples, Barnabas had the foresight and boldness to go fetch him and bring him to the church at Antioch, which had been entrusted to the oversight of Barnabas by the leaders in Jerusalem (see Acts 11:22-25). In Antioch, Saul's brilliance began to show and he quickly rose into the ranks of the "prophets and teachers" of that church listed in Acts 13:1.

Paul was not to be Barnabas' last recruit, even if he was his greatest. On a relief mission to famine-stricken Jerusalem with his protege, they picked up "John whose other name was Mark" and brought him back to Antioch (Acts 12:25). John Mark, your discernment is over. Consider yourself called!

Prior to this, all we know about Mark is that he lived in Jerusalem with his mother, whose house was a gathering place for the early church, and perhaps Peter's "cathedral" prior to his departure for "another place" (probably Rome) in Acts 12. After this, we know that Mark experienced some difficulties. When Barnabas and Saul were set apart by the Holy Spirit for the first missionary journey, "they had John [Mark] with them to assist them" (Acts 13:5). That "assistance" likely entailed "administrative support": logistics, interpreting, perhaps letter writing... Unfortunately, however, Mark didn't make it very far. After an initial adventure on Cyprus, Paul and Barnabas returned to the mainland at Perga. "But John left them and returned to Jerusalem" (Acts 13:13). Paul would later characterize this act as "desertion" (Acts 15:38). But Barnabas, happily, was not ready to give up on his talented but, perhaps, immature cousin. He was determined to have Mark join him again

on the second journey, even though it meant a painful parting of ways with Paul.

The gamble paid off. Mark proved his worth. A decade later, Paul is writing to Timothy from Rome and telling him to "Get Mark and bring him with you; for he is very useful in serving me" (2 Tim 4:11). And Peter goes so far as to call Mark his "son" at the end of his first letter (5:13). Evidently, after a rough start, Mark proved himself a faithful and fruitful servant of the Gospel and to the Apostles, and eventually an evangelist in his own right.

Notice how simple Mark's vocation was. He was available. He had the right gifts. And then someone in the Church with authority (Barnabas) called him to put those gifts and availability to the service of the Gospel. Mark didn't necessarily desire the call or welcome it, and seems to have struggled with its demands. But when the call was renewed he did not refuse, and the rest is history.

Vocation is a mystery, but it doesn't need to be complicated. "If you today, you hear His voice" says the Psalm this Sunday, "harden not your hearts." That "voice" might come through a Barnabas asking for assistance, the voice of conscience aware that a certain path might be more pleasing to the Lord, or through an old lady asking a young frequenter of the adoration chapel of he or she has considered the religious life. But if it is a voice calling you to greater generosity and service, to a holy way of life, to becoming more conformed to Christ... consider it Jesus Himself calling under one of His many guises. Like with St. Mark, he won't take away your freedom, or your power to say "no" (even after you have given an initial 'yes'!). As with Mark, He is not chiefly interested in what you might prefer or desire. Nor, on the other hand, does He lack a back-up plan if His most loving hopes for you are scuttled. Writing as one who, like Mark, did not exactly receive the call with joy at first, trust me: there is no better purpose towards which your talents can be put, no occupation more fulfilling, no consolation more satisfying, than to spend yourself and be spent in the service of the Lord and the salvation of souls. Saint Mark, pray for us and obtain for us many religious vocations for the young John and Jean Marks at our parish!

We are blessed to have new members joining our parish and we'd like to introduce them to our parish family here. If you see them around the parish, please introduce yourself, too!

Meet Brant Thomsen who has been married to his wife and best friend, Rochelle, for twenty-nine years. While not Catholic, Brant came to know Jesus through his wife. Together they have three daughters, one is a nurse at the birth center at Regions, another is finishing up at St. Kate's, and their third will be headed to Boston for college next year.

Brant has a private therapy practice which began in 2016 and he was a clinical social worker in the schools for fifteen years.

Back in 2019 Brant felt a gentle moment of Mary's presence. This peaceful moment brought him stillness. It was then that he knew he would become Catholic, but he said there is a difference between knowing and doing, and at first he pushed against it.

As the pandemic began, he started providing trauma therapy to over twenty people each week. Throughout this time his conversion continued and his conviction strengthened. While going through RCIA he was introduced to the JPII Healing Center and the work of Dr. Bob Schuchts. He attended a retreat they put on for Catholic therapists which was truly life-changing.

Brant was received into the Catholic Church at the Cathedral of Saint Paul in 2023 and discovered Saint Mark's because of the adoration chapel. He began receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation at Saint Mark's, and this sacrament is something which continues to keep drawing him deeper into his relationship with Christ. Saint Mark's is where he feels cared for, and he knows that this is right where he is meant to be.

Brant is a concert pianist 'on the side' with a focus on Chopin and Rachmaninoff and has been an organist at Episcopal and Lutheran churches for about eight years. He rode his unicycle across the state in five days, and has an African grey parrot who speaks and imitates his family's voices. When not enjoying the company of his wife and children, he enjoys kayaking and seeking solitude.

He says that Adoration and Mary draw him closer to Christ and is where all of the other things in his life are centered.

WHAT'S GOING ON TODAY (JAN. 28)?

Glad you asked. It's Small Group Invitation Weekend!

OKAY ... WHAT'S A "SMALL GROUP"?

A group of 6-10 people who come together regularly (weekly or every other week) for an hour and a half, to encounter Christ together through praise, prayer, learning, and sharing God's work in their lives.

SO WHY SHOULD I BE IN ONE?

So many reasons...

- 1) Because Jesus calls us to come to know him and love him together, not alone
- 2) Because [while] we can meet each other at Mass, and get to know folks at Coffee and Donuts, [but] it's only in smaller groups that we can truly form deep Christian community
- 3) Because this is a place where you can also invite others to come and encounter Jesus

Is this just what we're doing for Lent this year? No. And also, yes.

This Lent we want everyone to have the opportunity to experience Christian community in a small group for at least 5-6 weeks. But every group and every group member will have the chance to discern whether to continue after Lent. Ultimately our parish vision, shared by the Archbishop, is that every Catholic will be in a small group.

(And not just for Lent!)

But didn't I hear something about small groups last fall?

Last fall many of your fellow parishioners took part in a Small Group Leader Formation Series. Most of these small groups, and others yet to come, are the fruit of that formation.

SACRAMENTS

Detailed information about Sacraments and Sacramental preparation can be found at onestrongfamily.org/sacraments or by contacting the Parish Center.

BAPTISMS are celebrated on the 3rd Saturday of every month at 10 AM (exceptions for holidays or major parish events). You must register for Baptism at least one month before your desired date. If this is your first child being baptized in the Catholic Church a Baptism preparation class is needed at least two months before the Baptism takes place.

SACRAMENTAL MARRIAGE preparation must begin at least six months prior to your wedding date. Weddings are most often celebrated on Saturdays at 2 PM.

If you know of a Catholic who is homebound and would like to receive weekly Communion or have their confession heard, please contact the Parish Center to learn more about our Homebound Ministry.

RECEIVING THE EUCHARIST: All are welcome to join us in worship at the Church of Saint Mark. Nevertheless, because the Holy Eucharist is the real Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved to those Catholics who are in full moral and doctrinal communion with the Catholic Church, are not conscious of any grave unconfessed sin, and who have kept the Eucharistic fast of one hour.
