# From the Heart of the Shepherd

## The Gift of Our Weakness



A SWE ENTER the holiest week of the year, the Palm Sunday liturgy allows us to remember our Lord's entrance into Jerusalem, before his arrest on Holy Thursday and crucifixion on Good Friday. It is interesting that our four gospels tell the

life of Jesus in slightly different ways, but in their telling of the Passion of our Lord, they are almost identical. These days are the crescendo of the life of Jesus. They are the purpose for which he came and are at the heart of our faith. For us, the week ahead summarizes it all! For the early Christians, it was these few days that were often a difficult hurdle for those to whom they proclaimed the Good News. They complained that the Jews demanded signs and the Greeks were looking for wisdom, while they were proclaiming "Christ crucified, a stumbling block to the Jews and foolishness to Gentiles." [1 Cor 1: 22-23]

#### THE EYEWITNESSES

When we consider the centrality of this week in the history of salvation, one thing that stands out is the failure of those who were eyewitnesses. We hear the story of their weakness every year, but today I want to consider it from another perspective—as a gift!

Remember that this was a privileged group. For a period of three years, the apostles were constant companions of our Lord. They traveled and ate with him. They heard him speak and saw him perform many miracles. They were even given the authority to cure sickness and drive out demons in his name. [See Mt 10: 1] They were showered with God's grace in a ways that were unique. Up until the very end, our Lord was opening his Heart to them and inviting them closer.

Yet these men failed many times. There was jealousy among them. Often they didn't understand what the Lord was trying to tell them. They argued about which of them was the greatest [see Lk 22: 24] and wanted to call down fire from heaven to destroy those who didn't agree with them [see Lk 9: 54]. The failures of the first witnesses are most evident in the telling of the Passion of our Lord. One betrayed him. Three fell asleep when he needed them. One denied knowing him at all, and all of them ran away. Only one returned to be by the side of Christ when he died. And our Lord was buried by a stranger. Why do much failure and weakness?

#### BOASTING IN OUR WEAKNESSES

I think it is because today, as we begin this week that marks the apex of our faith, our Lord has an important lesson for us about what it means to be his disciples. Remember that the apostles were no different than us. We are all weak. As we have journeyed through Lent, each of us has had the opportunity to see the ways in which we deny and betray God, fall asleep and run away out of fear – not just in moments of crisis but in ordinary moments as well. None of us is strong enough to stand by the cross of Jesus. We need God's grace to do so.

We all wish we were strong. We would like our successes to be known and our failures to be hidden. It is hard for us to believe that God actually blesses us with weakness, but he does. In our Epistle today St Paul describes the weakness of Christ, who "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness, and found human in appearance." [Phil 2: 7] Our Lord took on our human weakness to sanctify it, to share it with us, and so that we might be raised to glory with him in heaven. This is the reason that St Paul was able to say, "I will boast of the things that show my weakness." [2 Cor 12: 10] He is grateful for his weakness because it allows him to share more deeply in the life of Jesus, and makes him aware of his fundamental need for God's grace.

My prayer for each of us this Holy Week is for a deeper knowledge of our own weakness, and a more perfect dependence on the grace of God in all things.

## SACRAMENTS

**BAPTISMS** are celebrated on the 3rd Saturday of every month at 10 AM (exceptions for holidays or major parish events). You must register for Baptism at least one month before your desired date. If this is your first child being baptized in the Catholic Church a Baptism preparation class is needed at least two months before the Baptism takes place.

**SACRAMENTAL MARRIAGE** preparation must begin at least six months prior to your wedding date. Weddings are most often celebrated on Saturdays at 2 PM.

**IF YOU KNOW OF A CATHOLIC WHO IS HOMEBOUND** and would like to receive weekly Communion or have their confession heard, please contact the Parish Center to learn more about our Homebound Ministry.

**RECEIVING THE EUCHARIST:** All are welcome to join us in worship at the Church of Saint Mark. Nevertheless, because the Holy Eucharist is the real Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved to those Catholics who are in full moral and doctrinal communion with the Catholic Church, are not conscious of any grave unconfessed sin, and who have kept the Eucharistic fast of one hour.
